

CONNECT (BUILD RELATIONSHIPS)

- 1. Do you have any special plans as you head into Holy Week?
- 2. Would you rather be a spectator of a parade or a participant in a parade? Explain.
- 3. If you could choose one hymn or worship song to sing as an expression of your love to Jesus right now, what would it be?

THRIVE (EXPLORE BIBLICAL TRUTH)

- 4. Read Luke 19:28-40. In verse 28, we read that Jesus is "going up to Jerusalem." What's the significance of this? (See 9:21-22, 44, 51; 18:31).
- 5. What is the significance of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a colt that has never been ridden before, and what does this passage tell us about the faithfulness of God? (See Zechariah 9:9)
- 6. What does the crowd's response and their words in verse 38 tell us?
- 7. These same people who rejoiced over Jesus' entry into Jerusalem would scream "crucify him" in just a few days. What does this sort of hypocrisy teach us about true worship?

8. Why do you think Jesus wept over Jerusalem? What did you notice in this passage about the heart and character of God?

COMMIT (BE ON MISSION)

- 9. As you think about this entire passage, what are your takeaways? Is there something you learned about God or yourself? Is there something you need to do?
- 10. How might this passage prepare your heart for Good Friday and Easter Sunday?
- 11. Add your "hosanna" to the praise of creation. Spend some time as a group or personally this week worshipping Jesus.

"When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" LUKE 19:37-38
