

CONNECT (BUILD RELATIONSHIPS)

- 1. Growing up, what is something that you or your family did or believed that you later discovered not everyone else did or believed?
- 2. Have you ever changed your mind on a deeply held conviction or practice?
- 3. Think about the last time you had a healthy disagreement and compare that with a time you experienced an unhealthy one. What was the difference? In the end with both, did anyone change their mind or perspective?

THRIVE (EXPLORE BIBLICAL TRUTH)

- 4. How has the divisive political and social climate of the past few years impacted your relationships?
- 5. Read James 1:19-20, Titus 3:2, Proverbs 17:14 and Proverbs 18:2. What do each of these verses reveal about how disagreement can lead to sin and damage our relationships? What safeguards are offered to prevent this?
- 6. Read Ephesians 4:1-3 and Colossians 3:12-14. How could pursuing the attitudes and actions listed lead to greater freedom and peace between those who disagree?

- 7. Read John 13:34–35, where Jesus gives a clear guideline on how to love others. What stands out to you? If you lived out this commandment, how could it affect your immediate circle of influence?
- 8. Read Philippians 2:14–15 and reflect on how this attitude could change the way you interact with others in your family, your workplace, our church, etc.

COMMIT (BE ON MISSION)

- 9. When it comes to your beliefs and practice of faith, how do you determine what is an absolute, what is a distinctive and what is a preference? Is there any place where you may have mixed up the categories?
- 10. How could a church with diverse opinions, who modeled how to disagree in a godly manner, be an incredible witness in our community and culture?
- 11. Talk about some ways you've learned to move toward people who think differently than you while still holding on to your convictions.
- 12. What are the distinctives and preferences we should be talking about as a church? What would you suggest is a helpful forum and method of having that conversation?
