DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

CONNECT (BUILD RELATIONSHIPS)

1. What is your favourite movie or book that involves an epic journey? What do you love about it?
2. Do you have a “bucket list” journey that you would love to take or have taken? What is it?
3. Describe a time when you have been lost and needed to use a compass or GPS to find your way to your destination?

THRIVE (EXPLORE BIBLICAL TRUTH)

4. Read Matthew 9:35, Mark 1:14, Luke 4:43. What was the message Jesus was proclaiming? What is the Gospel of the Kingdom? How is this different from “barcode” Christianity that simply is about getting into heaven and avoiding hell?
5. Read Matthew 6:33. What does it mean to seek first God’s kingdom? What is the result?
6. Read Matthew 28:19-20 & Matthew 22:37-38. At Compass, “Our mission is to glorify God by making disciples (Great Commission) who love him completely and others sacrificially (Great Commandment).” Which part of this calling naturally attracts you? Which part do you struggle with? How do both parts together summarize the mission of the Church?
7. At Compass, our vision is to be “a multi-site church (better together), committed to the spiritual transformation of people, families and communities.” What does spiritual transformation look in these three areas? How do we bring it about?

COMMIT (BE ON MISSION)

8. How did you feel when you read “the invitation” letter? (comforted, awkward, inspired, confused) Why? This week and throughout the series, plan to reread the letter regularly (perhaps daily), highlighting the parts that resonate or challenge you, affirm or bother you. Ask God to clarify what he is revealing to you. Go one step further; visit www.fathersloveletter.com and read the scriptures that accompany God’s love letter.

9. Many people picked up a compass during our Sunday gathering as an indication of their commitment to go on the journey we are taking as a church. What are some ways you can be intentionally engaged in the journey? (i.e. plan to attend each week, work through discussion questions with others, ask God to reveal or clarify what your part/contribution might be to our church etc.)

Memorize this week: “This is eternal life, that they [his disciples] may know you, the only real God, and Jesus the anointed, whom you have sent.” John 17:3.
